> Choosing the car that's right for you:

> Determining your budget and financing options:

A good rule of thumb is that your total monthly car payments should not exceed 20 percent of your monthly take-home pay.

> The dealership:

Visit at least three to five dealerships. Compare prices and experiences, and build your bargaining confidence and tactics.

> Negotiating:

You should arm yourself with as much information as possible, including the dealer's invoice costs and price quotes on similarly equipped, same model-year vehicles. If you're buying from a dealership or private owner, know exactly how much you can afford and don't feel pressured to spend one penny more.

> Signing the contract:

Make sure you fully understand the conditions of sale, the trade-in price on your existing car, and any financing agreement.

> Taking delivery:

Make sure your car contains all the items you purchased and that the car is in pristine condition (if new) or the same condition it was when you signed the contract.
